
Housing is Top of Mind for Maryland Residents

For the first time, Maryland voters cited **Housing Affordability as their top concern**, above that of other policy issues like crime, education, and transportation.

This was followed by **Taxes and Property Taxes** as the second largest issue, which further shows the strains on household budgets.

ECONOMIC CRISIS

According to the Maryland State of the Economy Report from the Office of the Comptroller, Maryland's economy grew at a rate of 1.6%, compared to 13.9% nationally. It is also why Maryland is facing budget deficits instead of surpluses like our surrounding states.

Maryland's housing crisis is a key reason for this. Housing prices have far outpaced wage growth, and decreased home sales and housing construction permits have resulted in lower economic activity and tax revenues. It is hitting Maryland's workforce the hardest:

The survey was conducted January 6-9, 2025 and reached 800 adults (800 weighted) adults, age 18 or older, who indicated they were registered to vote in Maryland. The overall margin of error is +/- 3.5%.
